READING(S)

First Reading: Proverbs 8:1-4, 22-31
Does not Wisdom call and Understanding raise her voice?
On the heights, beside the way, at the crossroads she takes her stand; beside the gates in front of the town, at the entrance of the portals she cries out: "To you, O people, I call, and my cry is to all that live.

"The LORD created me at the beginning of creation, the first of the LORD's acts of long ago. Ages ago I was set up, at the first, before the beginning of the earth. When there were no depths I was brought forth, when there were no springs abounding with water. Before the mountains had been shaped, before the hills, I was brought forth, when the LORD had not yet made earth and fields or the world's first bits of soil. When the LORD established the heavens, I was there, when he drew a circle on the face of the deep, when he made firm the skies above, when he established the fountains of the deep, when he assigned to the sea its limit, so that the waters might not transgress the LORD's command, when he marked out the foundations of the earth, then I was beside the LORD, like a master worker, and I was daily the LORD's delight, rejoicing before the LORD always, rejoicing in the LORD's inhabited world and delighting in the human race." Second Reading: Romans 5:1-5

Gospel Reading: John 16:12-15

The Holy Gospel according to John, the 16th chapter. Glory to you, O Lord!

[Jesus said,] "I still have many things to say to you, but you cannot bear them now. When the Spirit of truth comes, he will guide you into all the truth; for he will not speak on his own, but will speak whatever he hears, and he will declare to you the things that are to come. He will glorify me, because he will take what is mine and declare it to you. All that the Father has is mine. For this reason I said that he will take what is mine and declare it to you."

WEEKLY DEVOTIONS

Monday - Prayer of the Day

Almighty Creator and ever-living God: we worship your glory, eternal Three-in-One, and we praise your power, majestic One-in-Three. Keep us steadfast in this faith, defend us in all adversity, and bring us at last into your presence, where you live in endless joy and love, Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever.

Tuesday - Connections with the Liturgy

The rite of Confession and Forgiveness (ELW, p. 94) begins in the name of the Trinity. The standard greeting with which to begin the Sunday liturgy (ELW, p. 98) proclaims the Trinity. Our worship concludes with a Trinitarian blessing. Christian worship begins and ends not the usual social hello of "Good morning" and "Bye, now." Rather, we are privileged to stand within and under uniquely Christian phrases: we give to one another and we receive the grace, love, and communion of the Triune God.

Wednesday - Especially for Children

Following St. Patrick, the use of the three-leaf clover to suggest the Trinity remains popular in Christianity. Each one clover is three. God is not simple, a great man in the sky, although often artists may suggest this. A better image is the three-leaf clover, for God is not just a big human, but rather the mystery of three-in-one.

Thursday - Connections with Creation

Proverbs 8 speaks poetically of creation's majesty, all to highlight the preexistence of wisdom (v. 22). Wisdom contributes to the formation of creation, such that the natural order inspires her to play and delight. In other words, wisdom recognizes herself within creation and rejoices at that fact. On Holy Trinity Sunday, consider how you might ground this mystery of faith in natural settings that don't fully explain but naturally exhibit triune wisdom within creation. Don't let fear of heresy stop you from exploring classic images of sun, light, and heat; the three-leafed shamrock; or water in its three forms (solid, liquid, and gas). Simply remember that they are limited images of the unlimited wisdom that still plays and delights within creation today.

Friday - Reflection on the Gospel Reading

That we are called Christian, the ones marked by Christ, is clear in this passage: the Father and the Spirit declare the truth we have witnessed in the crucified and risen Christ. Today in worship we receive this truth in the proclamation of this word.

Saturday - A Hymn for the Day

With his text "Come, join the dance of Trinity" (ELW 412), Richard Leach made available to contemporary worshipers an image used by those church fathers who wrote of the perichoresis, the dancing around, the interweaving, of the persons of the Trinity in the divine life. The stanzas proclaim the dancing God as creator, as Jesus Christ, and as the Spirit of freedom, and we are invited to join in God's dance. The image of dancing with God is a welcome addition to the church's dominant far more stagnant picture of the Trinity. Leach, who previously served as a pastor in the United Church of Christ, is now a lay member of the ELCA.
