

#### **Quilts of Love**

Some of them have been drug through the dirt. Some are tattered. Some are still nearly new. Many may have never been laundered because their owners need the little water they have for their survival. What they all have in common is that they are giving comfort and hope to those that have them. They are the quilts made by the Faith Lutheran Quilters.

In our house there are quilts that have been made by three generations of family. Those quilt makers were our grandmothers, mothers, aunts, and siblings. Their quilts will be sent forward to three additional generations. It is very likely that the youngest member of our family will receive a quilt made by her Great-Great-Great Grandmother.

As I was nearing retirement from the NDDOT in 2014 LaDonna Brave Bull Allard, also known as Tamakawastewin (Good Earth Woman), of Standing Rock bestowed upon me a Star Quilt. LaDonna was a tribal historian and protector of the earth. We worked together on projects that helped tell the stories of the people of Standing Rock. My quilt has the colors of the earth and sky, and is a treasure.

Judy's Aunt Kathy, the last of her mother's siblings, like many of the Faith Quilters has been a quilt maker for decades. Her quilts are given to babies and high school graduates. Judy and I have watched mothers and graduates' smiles become wide when they received a quilt from Aunt Kathy.

The quilts of Faith Lutheran are made by people with love for the unknown person who will receive them. Their love enters the quilt from their minds, their hearts, their fingers, and their souls. They have been sent away to points around the world. Where someone's hands are wrapping their quilt around themselves, their children, and their elders.

It is probable the quilts of the Faith Lutheran Quilters have provided comfort to young and old amidst falling bombs. Comfort for when they are being persecuted for who they are. And comfort as they go to sleep wondering and hoping that tomorrow will bring them food to eat.

## Pastor Derek's Parables

Grace and peace to you sisters and brothers in Christ!

Jesus told his disciples in his final conversation with them before being arrested and put to death, "I give you a new commandment, that you love one another. Just as I have loved you, you also should love one another. By this everyone will know that you are my disciples, if you have love for one another." (John 13:34-35)

I joked a couple of weeks ago, as we had yet another Gospel reading from Jesus' final discourse with his disciples, that it seemed like we had been in that section of scripture for a very long time. That makes some sense though as it was an incredibly important moment, both for Jesus and his followers. As we were reflecting on this particular teaching of Jesus' this year it made me wonder, what would I want to tell someone, especially those closest to me, before I die?

I have been present at or close to the time of death for many people. If someone is able to still communicate it is almost never wordy, or complicated wisdoms, or family secrets, or anything like that. Without fail, the person tells those closest to them how much they love them and how they want them to continue on living a life of love and joy. Jesus was no different.

On that final night, Jesus ate with his disciples, washed their feet letting them know how deeply he loved them and cared for them. Then he encouraged his disciples to love one another. Jesus could have shared probably a million other things. He could have taught them the secrets of the universe. He could have given specific insights or directions for life. Of everything in all the universe that Jesus could have shared in those final moments, he chose to share with them how much he loved them and cared for them and he encouraged them to love one another, calling it a "New Commandment" even. In fact, he even tells the disciples that the rest of the world will know that they are Jesus' followers, not because the disciples say so, but by how they love others.

We have started our *Faces Of Our Faith* worship series reflecting on individuals in the Bible who had a profound impact on the faith of the church and we will also be reflecting on our own lives and thinking about those individuals who have had a profound impact on our faith from our personal lives. I would venture a guess that the people who had a profound impact on your faith journey were people who showed you and others a great deal of love.

What would it look like in your life if you lived out this "New" commandment? What would


