### Sermon Reading: Ephesians 3:14-21

For this reason I bow my knees before the Father, from whom every family in heaven and on earth takes its name. I pray that, according to the riches of his glory, he may grant that you may be strengthened in your inner being with power through his Spirit and that Christ may dwell in your hearts through faith, as you are being rooted and grounded in love. I pray that you may have the power to comprehend, with all the saints, what is the breadth and length and height and depth and to know the love of Christ that surpasses knowledge, so that you may be filled with all the fullness of God.

Now to him who by the power at work within us is able to accomplish abundantly far more than all we can ask or imagine, to him be glory in the church and in Christ Jesus to all generations, forever and ever. Amen.

## WEEKLY DEVOTIONS

### Monday - Prayer of the Day

O God, form the minds of your faithful people into your one will. Make us love what you command and desire what you promise, that, amid all the changes of this world, our hearts may be fixed where true joy is found, your Son, Jesus Christ our Lord, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever. Amen.

### **Tuesday - Reflection on the Revelation Reading**

Imagery in Revelation often feels scary to people and causes anxiety over who is saved by God and who isn't. The book is complex and does not fit our interpretive categories easily. However, this passage, which summarizes the whole letter, concludes Revelation with an open invitation and possibility that in the end God's grace prevails. There's an invitation to "come." Everyone who is thirsty is invited and welcome. "Let anyone who wishes take the water of life as a gift" (22:17). How does this ending help hearers rethink what they assume about this powerful and puzzling conclusion of the Christian scriptures?

#### Wednesday - Let the Children Come

One of the amazing things about Paul and Silas's imprisonment is that their testimony knows no bounds. You can take this story as an opportunity to talk with the kids in your life about what it means to share the good news of Jesus with others. On this day, consider asking kids to write or share one thing they know or love about Jesus and one person they can share their story with. After they have shared, you and the kids can close in prayer for courage and strength to share this news with others. This activity could help children better understand and connect with the scripture passages of the day, while also encouraging them to take an active role in spreading the good news of Jesus.

#### Thursday - Life on the Earth

Monotheistic religion wants to give to God the powers of the universe, and so in the biblical worldview, God continues to create the natural world, but also can wreck it. Thus in the Bible God sends earthquakes, for example in today's first reading, to achieve some divine purpose. It is interesting that in Luke's story, the purpose of God in the earthquake was not to punish, but to save. However, for the last few centuries, it is far more difficult for Christians to maintain this worldview, and churches disagree about how to speak about God's role in natural disasters such as floods, volcanos, and earthquakes.

#### Friday - Reflection on the Acts Reading

This delightful narrative has it all, from a boisterous fortune-teller to a fortuitous earthquake. The point of the story is that God is leading the apostles through many adventures, including imprisonments, towards the conversion of the Roman Empire. We join with the jailer and his family to rejoice in baptism. Although the author of Revelation despairs of life under Roman domination, Luke suggests that the mission of Christ through the Roman Empire will succeed. This Sunday concludes Year C's Easter semi-continuous reading through Acts.

#### Saturday - Connection with Creation

In Revelation, Jesus refers to himself as "the bright morning star." The planet Venus is usually referred to as the morning star, or the evening star, depending on when it is visible. Venus is the brightest object in the sky other than the sun or the moon. Using a sky mapping app (Sky Map or Sky View, for example), you can easily find where the planet Venus is in the sky. Invite the assembly to look up at the morning or evening sky and be reminded by the bright planet Venus that Christ is our true light, our true guiding star, the beginning and the end.
