



In the middle 1960s, my mother asked me what I wanted for Christmas. I told Mom an electric football game and showed her the one in the Christmas catalog I wanted. She visited with Dad and they agreed to get me this game. Mom sent the order off in the mail and my wait for it to arrive began.

A few days before Christmas, when I got home from school, I started to ask if the football game had arrived. Mother said it has not. Everyday the answer was no. On December 24th when it was not in the mail, I was resigned to the fact that I would have to wait till after Christmas for my present.

When my siblings and I were young, presents were not placed around the tree until Christmas Eve which continued our belief that they were brought by Santa Claus. This Christmas Eve Mom told me to help Dad bring in the presents. I went with him out into the cold of the evening to the building where he and Mom and hid them. When we went in and the light was turned on, I saw it. My electric football game was there.

Many decades of years past by before I realized that that Christmas was when I learned about the importance of Advent. That season taught me that the humility in my wait resulted in the joy of my gifts' arrival.

## Pastor Sylvia's Parables



"O holy night, the stars are brightly shining, it is the night of the dear Savior's birth;

Long lay the world in sin and error pining, till he appeared and the soul felt its worth.

A thrill of hope the weary world rejoices, For yonder breaks a new and glorious morn."

Placide Cappeau, translated by John Sullivan Dwight

These words are taken from the beloved Christmas carol "O Holy Night" and serve as the inspiration for our Advent and Christmas worship series from A Sanctified Art: "How Does A Weary World Rejoice?" Over the next six weeks or so, we will reflect on this question together alongside the account of Jesus' birth from Luke's gospel.

Perhaps, like me, you find yourself weary heading into this holiday season. The days are shorter, life is hectic and busy with days scheduled to the hilt. You leave the house when it is still dark and don't return until long after the sun sets. Or maybe this season is one of isolation and loneliness as the lengthening darkness and bad weather keep you confined to your home. Perhaps the holidays which bring joy to others are reminders of losses you've experienced, of the people who won't be there around your holiday tables. Perhaps you are just worn down from reading all the sad news in the world and worrying about what the future will hold. Or maybe you are weary from one of a thousand other reasons that we humans grow tired in body and soul.

If any of this is true for you, I invite you to join us this Advent and Christmas season as we seek to find joy, even in the midst of weariness. Through worship, story, song, art, and reflection, we will hear the good news about Emmanuel - God-with-us - and discover paths of rejoicing.

We will begin our observance of Advent on Sunday, November 26 with our normal Sunday worship schedule of 8:30am and 11am (livestream at 8:30am). Then on Wednesdays beginning November 29, we will have a chance to dive deeper into these stories and themes with midweek services at 12:05pm and 7pm (livestream at 7pm). A light soup lunch will be served at 11:15am for the first three weeks (Nov. 29, Dec. 6, and Dec. 13). On Wednesday, December 20, we will hold a Longest Night Service at both 12:05pm and 7pm with a Liturgy for the Weary. These services are especially appropriate for anyone who is grieving or carrying a heavy burden of sickness or loss this season. Come as you are and find a space to place your sadness and weariness in the midst of holiday festivities.

In this waiting season of Advent, I hope that in worship you will experience a place to acknowledge your weariness, but also places to find joy in connection, to be amazed, to sing

songs of hope, and to be rooted in the good news of Jesus Christ, our Savior. A thrill of hope, the weary world rejoices...Amen! Come, Lord Jesus!


