READING

Reading: *Luke 20:27-38*

The Holy Gospel according to Luke, the 20th Chapter. **Glory to you, O Lord.**Some Sadducees, those who say there is no resurrection, came to [Jesus] and asked him a question: "Teacher, Moses wrote for us that if a man's brother dies leaving a wife but no children, the man shall marry the widow and raise up children for his brother. Now there were seven brothers; the first married a woman and died childless; then the second and the third married her, and so in the same way all seven died childless. Finally the woman also died. In the resurrection, therefore, whose wife will the woman be? For the seven had married her."

Jesus said to them, "Those who belong to this age marry and are given in marriage, but those who are considered worthy of a place in that age and in the resurrection from the dead neither marry nor are given in marriage. Indeed, they cannot die anymore, because they are like angels and are children of God, being children of the resurrection. And the fact that the dead are raised Moses himself showed, in the story about the bush, where he speaks of the Lord as the God of Abraham, the God of Isaac, and the God of Jacob. Now he is God not of the dead but of the living, for to him all of them are alive."

BRINGING IT HOME

This section provides guidance on how to discuss a passage from the Revised Common Lectionary for the week as a family! The devotions for this week are for Haggai 1:15-2:9

Reflection Questions

- We are in the season after Pentecost, when we learn how God's Spirit is with us through all of life. Imagine standing at the broken temple when everyone felt so tired. What did Haggai remind the people about?
- The people thought their new work was not as good as the old temple. What words of hope would you off er to help them keep building?

- Haggai told the people to be strong and work together. Share about a time when you built something with someone or played with others. How did it feel different than doing it alone?
- God promises, "I am with you." When you work to rebuild or make something new, what helps you remember that God's Spirit will give you strength and courage?
- Haggai said the new temple would shine with splendor. If you designed a temple filled with God's love, what would you build inside it to bring joy and courage?

Activity

Gather the children in your life into a circle. Read Haggai 2:4 aloud, and explain how the people were discouraged because rebuilding the temple felt hard. God promised, "I am with you." Those words gave the people courage to keep building.

Explain that courage means being brave and trying, even when something feels difficult or a little scary. Ask the children to name one thing that feels hard (e.g., helping a friend, sharing, trying something new, saying sorry after a mistake). One at a time, children step into the circle to create a big, bold, courageous movement —like stomping, leaping, standing tall, or flexing. After each new move, the group copies it together, so the circle builds a "Courage Dance." Add music to make it even more fun. Invite participants to share how it felt to practice moving courageously, and remind them God's Spirit is always with them.

End by having everyone put their moves together in one joyful sequence. Then, with hands stretched out wide, the group says together: "God is with us. Be brave!"

God of new beginnings, nothing is ever too far gone for you. Your love takes root in wild gardens; your hope rests among the dust and ruins. Inspire us with your lifegiving creativity to rebuild what's broken, creating something beautifully new.
