


LeAnn Severson, Chair of Library Task Group

Pastor Sylvia's Parables



"Do not be conformed to this age, but be transformed by the renewing of your mind, that you may discern what is the will of God - what is good and acceptable and perfect." - Romans 12:2

"Then the righteous will answer him, 'Lord, when was it that we saw you hungry and gave you food or thirsty and gave you something to drink? And when was it that we saw you a stranger and welcomed you or naked and gave you clothing? And when was it that we saw you sick or in prison and visited you?' And the king will answer them, 'Truly I tell you, just as you did it to one of the least of these brothers and sisters of mine, you did it to me.'"
- Matthew 25:37-40

As a pastor, I spend a lot of my time listening to people's stories and attending to the grief and pain of the world around us. I get to hear the joys and sorrows of so many, and I hear about how the world we live in - our culture, our community life, and current events - affects people's lives and spirits. More and more over the past 10 years, I have seen the corrosive effect of extreme partisanship on our communities, our relationships, our mental health, and our spirits.

In such an environment, it becomes more and more difficult to speak about our values and the things that matter to us, especially with folks we might disagree with. We increasingly turn inward, scrolling on our devices or watching our chosen TV channels more and more hours of the day. In our minds, "politics" becomes synonymous with "partisanship," even though politics is nothing more or less than people living together in organized communities and all that entails. We avoid conversations with people we aren't sure will agree with us, diminishing our connections and community life. Sometimes we never talk with anyone about what matters most, experiencing deepening levels of loneliness and disconnection. When we do speak about events going on in our communities (or post about them online), we increasingly give a knee jerk reaction, parroting lines that have been fed to us by the algorithms or the TV, listening to respond instead of listening to understand or connect, hoping only to one-up our "opponent."

I notice this tendency in myself and in so many others, and it takes a lot of effort and intention to choose to respond differently. Yet none of these responses - silence, avoidance, or destructive conflict - are faithful to the way of life God calls us to. As Christians, we are called to another way. In this tender time in our common life, we are called to learn and teach others how to speak publicly about our values in ways that build up community, model constructive conflict, and create positive change. If we as people of faith do not show another way, no one will.

The Palm Sunday Path is an effort to help us begin to step into this role. The Path is a growing, ecumenical movement of Christians who recognize now is the time for Christians to publicly witness to our Christian values as laid out for us by Jesus in Matthew 25 and to lead conversations and policy discussions around these values with our elected leaders of all parties and at every level: city, state, and federal.

The first step of this path envisions tens of thousands of Christians across multiple states gathering for public witness on Palm Sunday afternoon. This day was chosen because 2,000 years ago, Jesus entered into Jerusalem at the beginning of Passover on a donkey, an image reflecting his just, humble leadership and care for those in need. **Christian communities from across our region of western North Dakota are invited to gather at 3 pm on Palm Sunday, March 29, 2026 in a procession from Trinity Lutheran Church (502 N 4th St, Bismarck) to the ND State Capitol grounds for a time of communal prayer and public witness.** An ecumenical worship service reflecting the shared Biblical values of feeding the hungry, caring for the vulnerable and welcoming the stranger will be held at 4pm on the Capitol Steps. Other Christians across the Upper Midwest and throughout the United States will join us in this public witness in their own state capitals and cities at that same time.

We hope that you will join us on Palm Sunday afternoon as together we begin to walk this new way. We pray that God will transform and renew us and use us to help transform and renew our communities, as we remain publicly rooted in the values of Jesus. **Informational sessions about the Path will be held here at FLC on on Sunday, March 8 at 10am and on Wednesday, March 11 at 6pm in the East Room.** All are encouraged to attend one of these sessions. If you feel called to help more with this Path, or if you have any questions or concerns, please reach out to me by phone, email, or in person.

May God bless you as we journey with Jesus to Palm Sunday and the cross, trusting in God's love and resurrection power.

On Our Pilgrim Journey

While looking for inspiration in the Red Hymnal songs for Lent, I selected *I Want Jesus to Walk with Me*. An African American spiritual, it tells the story of those troubled journeys that we all have experienced that Jesus has helped us through many times.

I wondered what artists have recorded this song. Homer Quincy Smith's 1929 recording was likely the first. He was born in Florence, Alabama in 1902. In 1929 Homer founded a vocal gospel quartet called the Southernaires. Like ours in the Red Hymnal, Smith's version had three verses. The first and third were about his pilgrim journey and the middle was "when the night is falling walk with me." His rendition has been described as music most haunting.

It was also recorded by Marian Anderson. Anderson, possibly the greatest 20th century contralto, performed music from opera to spirituals. Born in 1897, she was recognized as a great singer and toured in the United States; but she was not immune to Jim Crow laws. Touring in Europe, Marian did not encounter the prejudices she experienced in the US.

In 1939 her manager was trying to schedule a concert at the Daughters of the American Revolution Constitution Hall in Washington, D.C. The DAR denied her to perform because she was black. Eleanor Roosevelt convinced her husband, President Franklin Roosevelt, to let her sing on the steps of the Lincoln Memorial.

On Easter Sunday, April 9, 1939, before a mixed race crowd of 75,000, she sang. Marian began with *America (My Country, 'Tis of Thee)* and ended with *Nobody Knows the Trouble I've Seen*. Amongst the other songs she sang was *Ave Maria*. The song that was so beautifully performed at Faith Lutheran on February 8th by Brett Loftesnes and Ann Loftesnes Porter in honor of their mother Jenell.

As Marian Anderson stood in front of the Abraham Lincoln statue and sang "sweet land of liberty" and "let freedom ring" Jesus was by her side. During our pilgrim journeys when our hearts are breaking and when we are in deep sorrows, Jesus is walking with us. We don't realize his presence; but he is there.

Goodbye for now and remember to always take time talk to the cows.
