First Reading: Amos 8:4-7

Hear this, you who trample on the needy, and bring to ruin the poor of the land, saying, "When will the new moon be over so that we may sell grain, and the Sabbath, so that we may offer wheat for sale?

We will make the ephah smaller and the shekel heavier and practice deceit with false balances, buying the poor for silver and the needy for a pair of sandals and selling the sweepings of the wheat."

So he summoned him and said to him, 'What is this that I hear about you? Give me an accounting of your management because you cannot be my manager any longer.' Then the manager said to himself, 'What will I do, now that my master is taking the position away from me? I am not strong enough to dig, and I am ashamed to beg. I

have decided what to do so that, when I am dismissed as manager, people may welcome me into their homes.' He said to him, 'Take your bill, sit down quickly, and make it fifty.' Then he asked another, 'And how much do you owe?' He replied, 'A hundred containers of wheat.' He said to him, 'Take your bill and make it eighty.' And his master commended the dishonest manager because he had acted shrewdly, for the children of this age are more shrewd in dealing with their own generation than are the children of light. And I tell you, make friends for yourselves by means of dishonest wealth so that when it is gone they may welcome you into the eternal homes.

"Whoever is faithful in a very little is faithful also in much, and whoever is dishonest

in a very little is dishonest also in much. If, then, you have not been faithful with the dishonest wealth, who will entrust to you the true riches? And if you have not been faithful with what belongs to another, who will give you what is your own? No slave can serve two masters, for a slave will either hate the one and love the other or be devoted to the one and despise the other. You cannot serve God and wealth."

#### **WEEKLY DEVOTIONS**

# **Monday - Prayer of the Day**

God among us, we gather in the name of your Son to learn love for one another. Keep our feet from evil paths. Turn our minds to your wisdom and our hearts to the grace revealed in your Son, Jesus Christ, our Savior and Lord.

# **Tuesday - Connections with the Liturgy**

Each week in the Prayers of Intercession (Evangelical Lutheran Worship, p. 105), we heed the call to pray for rulers (1 Tim. 2:1).

# **Wednesday - Especially for Children**

"I am telling the truth, I am not lying" (1 Tim. 2:7). Does this sound familiar? Maybe a tall tale being stretched by someone in the back seat of a car? Or perhaps overheard at the playground? All children lie. For young children, lying is a way of learning how the concrete world butts up against the "what if" world. How did Dad know it would rain today? Maybe words are magic? For older children, lying is a complicated relationship tool, full of pitfalls and social learning. Learning the difference between telling the truth and telling a lie is a childhood stepping stone to relating with others in honesty, morality, empathy, and even shrewdness. Help children discover the truths in many words stretching toward Jesus the Word and such a tiny bite of bread making a whole feast.

# Thursday - Life on the Earth

Historically, some people have exercised mastery over lands, waterways, and animals, through which they have acquired considerable wealth. Christians are now asking how to stand in relation to the whole of God's creation, knowing that it is God, not wealth, that guides our decisions.

# Friday - Reflection on the Gospel Reading

The children of light are called to be faithful to what has genuine value—the riches of the kingdom. God is our master, from whom come sometimes unlikely judgments about human life. Even the old one-year lectionary included this gospel, which is a considerable challenge for the preacher.

## Saturday - Hymn of the Day

"Son of God, eternal Savior" (ELW 655) includes in stanza 2 a prayer that we use God's gifts, which include money, for the good of others, and that we reject a "selfish greed of gain." The words are easier to sing than the lifestyle is to adopt. The hymn was written in 1893 by Somerset Lowry, an Irish Anglican priest. Of the sixty hymns he wrote, this is the only one in Evangelical Lutheran Worship.
