

Pastor Sylvia's Parables

The Lord has told you, O mortal, what is good, and what does the Lord require of you but to do justice, love kindness, and walk humbly with your God? - Micah 6:8

Some of you may have seen in the news recently that the IRS has said it will now "allow houses of worship to endorse candidates for political office without losing their tax-exempt status." ¹ Since 1954,

the Johnson Amendment has prevented 501(c)(3) non-profit organizations (including churches) from participating in or intervening in any political campaign on behalf of or in opposition to any candidate for public office. Basically, this has meant that any non-profit organization which publicly endorses or opposes any candidate is putting its non-profit status at risk. It's unclear how much the Johnson Amendment has been enforced over the years, as audits of specific tax-exempt nonprofits are subject to taxpayer privacy laws. Only one church has ever had its tax-exempt status revoked for violating this rule. ² But until now, both the law itself and the stated policy of the IRS has specifically prohibited churches and clergy from endorsing political candidates from the pulpit. I want to share with you that, despite this change, Pastor Derek and I will continue to observe the Johnson Amendment. And I want to share with you a few reasons why.

In our hyper-partisan and polarized political environment, it is already enough of a challenge to preach and lead faithfully and clearly according to the gospel without being seen as "too political." Speaking for or against certain candidates for office would only muddy the waters even further!

This doesn't mean that our faith doesn't inform our politics. In reality, the Gospel of Jesus Christ is highly "political." What I mean by that is that the Gospel has deep implications for our common life. Our political participation, our votes, and the policies of our government really matter for our neighbors - locally in school board elections and city and county commissions, in our state legislature, and nationally. Our faith should inform our political participation, which is why you will hear Pastor Derek and myself encourage you to faithfully participate in the political process and to actively work for cooperation and neighborliness to have a larger role in our political system. There is also a distinction between talking about *politics* and talking about *policies*. So, you will still hear us speak about *policies* that impact our neighbors, especially the most vulnerable, and you may hear us encouraging you to use

your voice to speak out on behalf of your neighbors. An example of this is the pastoral letter we sent out in January regarding the end of refugee resettlement, which goes against clear biblical teaching to welcome the stranger.

As your pastors, we are called to "preach and teach the Word of God in accordance with the Holy Scriptures and the Lutheran Confessions... to speak for justice in behalf of the poor and oppressed... and to guide [the congregation] in proclaiming God's love through word and deed." ³ The Bible has many things to say about justice, neighborliness, and how God desires our communities to care for the most vulnerable. Faithful proclamation of the Gospel speaks to these values.

However, instructing you to support one candidate or another is, in my view, an abuse of the pastoral office. It does not build up our community life, it does not encourage faithful discernment or allow for faithful disagreement, and it does not build trust in the pastor-parishioner relationship. By clearly leading, preaching, and teaching from biblical values and avoiding partisanship, Pastor Derek and I hope to model what it looks like to proclaim God's love through word and deed and give you tools to do that - in your own life and in our community life together. We trust that as we are shaped by the diverse community of love God has called us into, God's Spirit will speak in our hearts to guide our political witness as Christians, not for any one candidate or party, but for *policies* that reflect the values of love for our neighbors and enemies, and especially the most vulnerable in our society.

Finally, when clergy or churches endorse particular candidates for office, it opens us up to be viewed by politicians and political action groups as organizations to be wooed. There could even be the temptation for the votes churches represent to be "bought" by favors or money. And whether or not churches give in to that temptation, the mere possibility of it diminishes the credibility of the whole Body of Christ and negatively impacts our ability to proclaim the Gospel in a hurting world.

By continuing to observe the Johnson Amendment, our gospel witness here at Faith Lutheran will be more clear, as we focus on the values of community life and discipleship that God teaches us throughout scripture and which Jesus shows us in his life, death, and resurrection.

If you have questions about the Johnson Amendment, our approach to preaching on current events and issues, or anything that I've shared in this article, please stop in or give me or Pastor Derek a call. We are always willing to engage in good faith conversations about how we live together as God's people.
