



Pastor Derek's Parables



Grace and peace to you, sisters and brothers in Christ!

It's hard to believe since it seems like we were just celebrating Christmas, but we are quickly heading into the season of Lent. Both Pastor Sylvia and I are very excited about this year's Lenten theme. It is one we have talked about for a few years now and finally just decided we needed to make it happen. It's a topic many people don't really want to discuss, but it it's one

that we need to discuss and preferably discuss in a safe place with a community that cares.

The theme for our Lenten Season this year is Holy Living, Holy Dying. It begins Feb. 14th on Ash Wednesday by remembering our mortality, that "we are dust, and to dust we shall return." During the Sundays and Wednesdays of Lent, we will reflect on the tensions between the reality of death and the promise of the resurrection. We live finite lives in limited, mortal bodies, yet God calls for us to live a kingdom life with an eye toward eternity. We will reflect on how Jesus is both a God who dies and a God of resurrection. We will consider how death has already been defeated and yet we still await the final victory. Between services on the Sundays throughout Lent, we will host a series of workshops on end-of-life issues, including Advance Directives, Long Term Care, Estate Planning, Funeral Planning, and Writing Your Obituary. Guests who have expertise in each field will lead these workshops along with Pastor Sylvia and I.

None of us really want to think about, let alone talk about and plan for our own death or our loved one's death. We'd prefer to just ignore it until it's too late, leaving behind a difficult task for our loved ones. I have sat in funeral planning sessions with families who really struggled to know what their loved one would have wanted because they never discussed it. I have also sat in on funeral planning sessions where the individual had planned out their service and made all of the arrangements before hand. The relief and peace that gave to their loved ones was clearly visible in each instance.

Having our affairs in order, no matter how old you are or what stage of life you are in, is an incredible gift to our loved ones. It is also good stewardship of this gift of life that God has given to us. No, we don't want to think about our death, but through the gift that God has given us in Jesus, we can hold on to the hope we have been given, that death is not the end. We can trust in the hope of the resurrection. Trusting God and holding on to that hope can give us the strength to plan and prepare for that time. We can face it head on because we know that we no longer need to be afraid.

I encourage you all to take part and participate in this Lenten journey. Participate in the workshops, book studies, reflections, and the conversations. It might be difficult and will certainly stretch us all, but I do believe it will be life-giving and will help to give us and our loved ones a peace which passes all understanding.



FLCW Missions Group Thank You!

Our last shipment of items to Lutheran World Relief was sent in October. The total number of items shipped this year was 143 quilts, 32 personal care kits, 26 baby kits and 100 school kits. None of this could be done without the help of so many such as the faithful quilters, sewers, anyone donating any supplies, the confirmation students helping to fill the school bags, and the Men of Faith for delivering the boxes to the trucking company.

In addition, we sent 372 pillow case dresses to the Orphan Grain Train in Jamestown, 25 sweaters and 65 Veteran quilts given to Missouri Slope Care Center. We also gave quilts to Missouri Slope Care Center, Camp of the Cross as well as some individuals and sheets and towels to Ministry on the Margins.
