#### **READING**

**Reading:** *Luke 18:9-14* 

The Holy Gospel according to Luke, the 18<sup>th</sup> Chapter. **Glory to you, O Lord.** 

[Jesus] also told this parable to some who trusted in themselves that they were righteous and regarded others with contempt: "Two men went up to the temple to pray, one a Pharisee and the other a tax collector. The Pharisee, standing by himself, was praying thus, 'God, I thank you that I am not like other people: thieves, rogues, adulterers, or even like this tax collector. I fast twice a week; I give a tenth of all my income.' But the tax collector, standing far off, would not even lift up his eyes to heaven but was beating his breast and saying, 'God, be merciful to me, a sinner!' I tell you, this man went down to his home justified rather than the other, for all who exalt themselves will be humbled, but all who humble themselves will be exalted."

The Gospel of our Lord. Praise to you, O Christ!

#### **BRINGING IT HOME**

This section provides guidance on how to discuss a passage from the Revised Common Lectionary for the week as a family! The devotions for this week are for Psalm 65.

#### **Reflection Questions**

- We are in the Season after Pentecost, a time for deep growing and thanksgiving.
   Although the words "thank you" don't appear in the translation of this psalm, it overflows with examples of gratitude and thankfulness from different parts of God's creation. Which words or phrases in the psalm show gratitude and thanks?
- There are many metaphors and images in this psalm (e.g., roaring seas, clothed meadows, etc.). Choose an item in nature or your home. What do you imagine its joy or expression of praise would look like?
- Remember the last time you offered praise to God. What did it look or sound like?
- How is feeling thankful or talking about being thankful different from putting thankfulness into action?
- Where have you noticed things to be thankful for this past week? Where could you look for them in the week to come?

#### **Activity**

Inspired by this psalm filled with joy and gratitude, today's activity will have you and the children in your life moving through God's creation with a joyful, grateful, and playful perspective. In advance, map out a route through a room in your home, through the rest of your home, and, if possible, outdoors, to reflect on the psalm with words, movements, and conversation. If the weather prohibits this, try getting creative by using:

- natural elements (such as bowls of water, rocks, plants, and flowers)
- Photos of elements (e.g., mountains, bodies of water, meadows)
- Audio/video depictions of nature, using an internet-connected device Just as the psalm progresses from the personal to the global, your walk will begin in a room of your home and expand. Chart out your route, activities, and prompts for each stop in whatever way makes sense for you, using the guidelines below to guide your exploration.

Verses 1–3: (initial room) Clap hands or stomp joyfully while saying, "Thank you, God!" or "You are amazing!" Pose like you're singing or playing an instrument to show joyful noise.

Verse 4–5: (other room in your home) Place hands over heart or stretch arms wide and say, "I feel welcome here," or "God meets us in this place."

Verses 6–8: (outdoor or mountain-inspired space) Stand tall like a mountain, stretch arms up like trees, and say, "God, you are strong!" or "Wow, God!"

Verses 9–11: (outdoor or water-inspired space) Pretend to water plants, make rain sounds with fingers, and say, "You care for the earth," or "You fill our cups!" Verses 12–13: (outdoor or meadow-inspired space) Dance like flowers in the wind, buzz like bees, or call out, "All the earth sings!" or "We join the praise!"

End your walk by saying, "God's world is full of wonder, and when we move through it with joy and gratitude, we join all of creation in praising God."

#### **Prayer**

God of all creation, your love flows from the tallest mountain to the deepest sea. Teach us to notice how the world praises you through wonder, wind, and waves, and inspire us to join in their joyful song. Amen.
