Trick or Treat for UNICEF

On Halloween night 1950 in Philadelphia, a Sunday School class decided to ask for coins instead of candy as they went from house to house in their neighborhood. They raised \$17 (\$225 today) and donated it to the United Nations Children's Fund. The Children's Fund was established in 1946 to help children and young people whose lives were at risk – no matter what role their country played in World War II.

In 1960, when I was a 10-year-old trick-or-treater, my hometown, Hope, North Dakota, was holding their 7th consecutive Trick or Treat for UNICEF. The Hope Pioneer reported that throughout the world 55,000,000 children and mothers were receiving UNICEF aid in 87 countries.

Farm kids and city kids gathered at the Hope Auditorium where we were given black and orange badges and containers for collecting coins. The signal to start was given at 6:30 pm by the ringing of church bells and three "toots" of the creamery whistle. Throughout town the children went collecting pennies, nickels, and dimes.

At 8:00 pm we returned to the Auditorium for the party which was sponsored by the local businesses. The Pioneer said "Please do not favor the trick or treat callers with goodies it makes it difficult for them when they come to the party." Treats were provided and games, like bobbing for apples, were played.

The October 26, 1961 Hope Pioneer said "Halloween was a day when masks were worn to scare away evil spirits...today American children are wearing masks to help combat the evils of mass disease and malnutrition among other children..."

For many causes, the people of Faith Lutheran have responded with grace and generosity when asked to help. When was the last time we responded to a cause that was identified by our children? If our children come to us wearing masks asking for dollars to help other children, how will we respond?

Pastor Sylvia's Parables



"[The peoples] will beat their swords into plowshares, and their spears into pruning hooks; nation shall not lift up sword against nation, neither shall they learn war any more." - Isaiah 2:4

"They will not hurt or destroy on all my holy mountain; for the earth will be full of the knowledge of the LORD as waters cover the sea." - Isaiah 11:9

"God makes wars cease to the end of the earth; he breaks the bow, and shatters the spear; he burns the shields with fire." Psalm 46:9

Dear friends in Christ,

Perhaps, like me, you are weary of what feels like ever more frequent reports of violence in our country and around the world. Perhaps, like me, your morning paper, evening news report, or internet news feed is full of images of the destruction of bombs, the fear and pain of yet another mass shooting, or the horror of attacks of politically-motivated violence. Perhaps your heart, like mine, feels sick as you read the latest headline. And God forbid if you wade into the morass of comments on any online news article, where insults, derision, and violent language abound.

What are we, as followers of Jesus, to say and do about such things?

<u>Pray.</u>

Come before God with your fear and despair and doubt and anger. Join with the psalmist in asking, "How long, O Lord?!?"

Repent.

As Martin Luther wrote in The 95 Theses, "When our Lord and Master Jesus Christ said, "Repent" (Mt 4:17), he willed the entire life of believers to be one of repentance." Our life as disciples is meant to be a life of repentance, of turning around, of recognizing our own role in the harm which abounds in our relationships and communities. Ask yourself, as I am: where does *my own* language reflect our culture of violence? Do I talk about people I disagree with in demeaning terms, as if they are stupid or less-than or deserving of harm? Am I willing to change that pattern in my own life? Can I stand up to that kind of talk in my circles, sharing my own journey of repentance and calling those around me to the same?

Live out our mission.

Here at Faith Lutheran, we believe that God has called us to "build a welcoming, nurturing faith community guided by Jesus to share the Gospel." Live into that calling, dear people of God. Following the example of Jesus, welcome those who are not like you. Nurture

community in every aspect of your life, reaching out to new people by getting to know them - their values, fears, hopes, and dreams. Share the Gospel - the good news that God comes into our world of fear and pain to suffer alongside us and transform our weapons of violence into tools of growth, to make the peaceable Kingdom of God more and more abundantly present in this hurting world.

At our first confirmation class of this year, we read Psalm 46 together and asked our students to reflect on what parts of this psalm were good news to them. Several of the groups mentioned verse 9, quoted above, about God making wars cease to the end of the earth. This is our hope and our good news: that Christ comes as the Prince of Peace, and that we, as part of his Body on earth today, are called to be people of peace. May we pray, repent, and live according to that call.

Heart Fund

In the past month, our community has been shaken by ICE raids here in Bismarck. More than twenty of our neighbors have already been deported, and many more have been arrested or remain detained. While the headlines focus on the numbers, the greater weight falls on the families left behind. Spouses are suddenly without partners. Children are waking up without parents. Households are facing fear, grief, and the question of how to survive tomorrow.

As shepherds, we know the heart of Jesus is for the broken, the vulnerable, and the overlooked. Scripture reminds us that when one part of the body suffers, we all suffer (1 Corinthians 12:26). Right now, the body of Christ in Bismarck is suffering. This is a moment for us to respond with compassion and action.

To meet these urgent needs, **Bismarck Global Neighbors has established the Heart Fund**, a benevolence fund dedicated to supporting families directly impacted by these raids.

These gifts will be used for practical, life-sustaining help for those suddenly thrust into crisis, such as essentials like food, rent, utilities, and childcare. **Donations can be given directly to Global Neighbors** by mailing a check made out to "Bismarck Global Neighbors" with "Heart Fund" in the memo line to their office at 206 E.
