After this he went out and saw a tax collector named Levi sitting at the tax-collection station, and he said to him, "Follow me." And he got up, left everything, and followed him.

Then Levi gave a great banquet for him in his house, and there was a large crowd of tax collectors and others reclining at the table with them. The Pharisees and their scribes were complaining to his disciples, saying, "Why do you eat and drink with tax collectors and sinners?" Jesus answered them, "Those who are well have no need of a physician but those who are sick; I have not come to call the righteous but sinners to repentance."

BRINGING IT HOME

This section provides guidance on how to discuss a passage from the Revised Common Lectionary for the week as a family! The devotions for this week are for Luke 14:25-33

Reflection Questions

- We are in the Season after Pentecost, when the church grows in love, faith, and community. Jesus invites people to decide what matters most and what it means to follow him. What else does he say in our story?
- In the story, Jesus said something confusing: we must "hate" even our families. The word for "hate" here doesn't mean to be mean or angry; instead, "hate" means to turn away from something to follow a different path. What does Jesus want us to turn toward?
- Jesus uses surprising statements and stories to help us think, listen, and choose what is loving and just. What choice might not be easy to make, even though you know it is the loving and right thing to do?
- Jesus talked about a builder and a king. Let's re-read that part. What do these examples have in common? What do they show us about commitment and courage?
- What would you give up to advocate for someone else?

Activity

Jesus uses strong words and bold examples to help us know following him isn't always easy. We must consider what matters most and let go of things that get in the way. Jesus asks us to carry our own cross, or live by our values even when it's hard. A value is something you believe is really important to live by: respect, patience, helping others, telling the truth, trying your best, etc. Encourage the children in your life to name as many values as they can, recording them on a piece of paper or electronically. Then, invite the children to pick the top five values most important to them, and write, or draw, them down on their index card.

For added movement, consider placing values around the room. Children then walk to the one they value most, and share a time they lived it out.

For a game, create cards with values and matching action cards (e.g., kindness + helping a friend). Children match pairs and act out living their values.

Converse with them using these questions:

- Which value is the easiest to follow? Which is the hardest?
- When has following one of your values "cost" you something? What did you give up?
- What values do you live by that come from following Jesus?
- Are there moments when you act in ways that don't match your values? What helps you return to what matters?

End by affirming that following Jesus isn't about being perfect. Instead, it's about growing and choosing again and again to live in ways that are loving, just, and true. Invite participants to take their values list home as a reminder of who they are and who they're becoming.



Look it Up!

How do intentional communities benefit people?

Look up types of intentional communities: co-ops, housing cooperatives, mutual-aid groups, or shared land for growing food. How can groups like these support one another even if they don't all have the same resources?

Prayer

God, our teacher, your way of love is like no other. It expands our hearts and stretches our imagination, which is not always comfortable or easy. Keep us focused on this journey, sharing your radiant love with all the earth. Amen.
