First Reading: Acts 16:9-15

Second Reading: Revelation 21:10. 22 - 22:5

And in the spirit [one of the angels] carried me away to a great, high mountain and showed me the holy city Jerusalem coming down out of heaven from God.

I saw no temple in the city, for its temple is the Lord God the Almighty and the Lamb. And the city has no need of sun or moon to shine on it, for the glory of God is its light, and its lamp is the Lamb. The nations will walk by its light, and the kings of the earth will bring their glory into it. Its gates will never be shut by day—and there will be no night there. People will bring into it the glory and the honor of the nations. But nothing unclean will enter it, nor anyone who practices abomination or falsehood, but only those who are written in the Lamb's book of life.

Then the angel showed me the river of the water of life, bright as crystal, flowing from the throne of God and of the Lamb through the middle of the street of the city. On either side of the river is the tree of life with its twelve kinds of fruit, producing its fruit each month; and the leaves of the tree are for the healing of the nations. Nothing accursed will be found there any more. But the throne of God and of the Lamb will be in it, and his servants will worship him; they will see his face, and his name will be on their foreheads. And there will be no more night; they need no light of lamp or sun, for the Lord God will be their light, and they will reign forever and ever.

Gospel Reading: John 14:23-29

The Holy Gospel according to John, the 14th chapter. **Glory to you, O Lord!**Lesus answered (Judas (not Iscariot)) "Those who love me will keep my wor

Jesus answered [Judas (not Iscariot),] "Those who love me will keep my word, and my Father will love them, and we will come to them and make our home with them. Whoever does not love me does not keep my words; and the word that you hear is not mine, but is from the Father who sent me.

"I have said these things to you while I am still with you. But the Advocate, the Holy Spirit, whom the Father will send in my name, will teach you everything, and remind you of all that I have said to you. Peace I leave with you; my peace I give to you. I do not give to you as the world gives. Do not let your hearts be troubled, and do not let them be afraid. You heard me say to you, 'I am going away, and I am

coming to you.' If you loved me, you would rejoice that I am going to the Father, because the Father is greater than I. And now I have told you this before it occurs, so that when it does occur, you may believe."

WEEKLY DEVOTIONS

Monday - Prayer of the Day

Bountiful God, you gather your people into your realm, and you promise us food from your tree of life. Nourish us with your word, that empowered by your Spirit we may love one another and the world you have made, through Jesus Christ, our Savior and Lord, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever.

Tuesday - Connections with the Liturgy

In several places, Evangelical Lutheran Worship includes the image of the tree of life: the frontispiece to the calendar (p. 11); the frontispiece to the Easter Vigil (p. 266); the frontispiece to the Psalms (p. 333); the Thanksgiving at the Table VII (p. 67); and the Thanksgiving at the Table X (p. 69). Some hymns refer also to God's promised salvation as like the tree of life.

Wednesday - Let the Children Come

"Those who love me will keep my word, and my Father will love them, and we will come to them and make our home with them" (John 14:23). What wild and good news this is! If we love God, then God and Jesus will come and make their home with us! Brainstorm with the children in your life about what home with God looks like. What kind of home would God want? What kind of home would make Jesus feel most welcome? What kind of home would you and the children want? What kind of home would make them feel most welcome?

Thursday - Life on the Earth

Purple is usually the color of Lent, not Easter. Yet purple fits this day with Lydia, "a dealer in purple cloth" (Acts 16:14). Purple was associated with wealth because purple dye was rare and laborious to produce, extracted from mucus secretions of Murex sea snails. It took thousands of snails to extract enough, which could be done while the creature was alive but often involved killing them. Our clothing may not require snails but often is resource intensive—in fertilizer for cotton, in water and chemicals for leather, using fossil fuels for synthetics, with human lives in sweatshops. How do you balance the comfort and appearance of your clothing with the environmental costs involved?

Friday - Reflection on the Gospel Reading

This gospel emphasizes the comforting presence of the triune God within the believing community. We are enjoined to keep God's word (what Lutherans call "law"), and we are given the gospel promise that God will live within us.

Saturday - A Hymn for the Day

Brian Wren, ordained in 1965 in the United Reformed Church in Great Britain and now living in the United States, is well known for his concern for inclusive language and for his mastery of contemporary speech in hymn texts. His Easter hymn "Christ is risen! Shout Hosanna!" (ELW 383) is appropriate for this Sunday, given its attention to Christian love, its celebration of the new creation, and its image of the tree of life. Note that in stanza 3 Wren calls God "the First and Last," rather than Alpha and Omega, an example of his preference for accessible speech.
