First Reading: Amos 6:1a, 4-7

Woe to those who are at ease in Zion and for those who feel secure on Mount Samaria.

Woe to those who lie on beds of ivory and lounge on their couches and eat lambs from the flock and calves from the stall, who sing idle songs to the sound of the harp and like David improvise on instruments of music, who drink wine from bowls and anoint themselves with the finest oils but are not grieved over the ruin of Joseph!

Second Reading: 1 Timothy 6:6-19 Gospel Reading: Luke 16:19-31

The Holy Gospel according to Luke, the 16th Chapter. **Glory to you, O Lord!** [Jesus said:] "There was a rich man who was dressed in purple and fine linen and who feasted sumptuously every day. And at his gate lay a poor man named Lazarus, covered with sores, who longed to satisfy his hunger with what fell from the rich man's table; even the dogs would come and lick his sores. The poor man died and was carried away by the angels to be with Abraham. The rich man also died and was buried. In Hades, where he was being tormented, he lifted up his eyes and saw Abraham far away with Lazarus by his side. He called out, 'Father Abraham, have mercy on me, and send Lazarus to dip the tip of his finger in water and cool my tongue, for I am in agony in these flames.' But Abraham said, 'Child, remember that during your lifetime you received your good things and Lazarus in like manner evil things, but now he is comforted here, and you are in agony. Besides all this, between you and us a great chasm has been fixed, so that those who might want to pass from here to you cannot do so, and no one can cross from there to us.' He said, Then I beg you, father, to send him to my father's house for I have five brothers—that he may warn them, so that they will not also come into this place of torment.' Abraham replied, They have Moses and the prophets; they should listen to them.' He said, 'No, father Abraham, but if someone from the dead goes to them, they will repent.' He said to him, 'If they do

not listen to Moses and the prophets, neither will they be convinced even if someone rises from the dead.' "

WEEKLY DEVOTIONS

Monday - Prayer of the Day

O God, rich in mercy, you look with compassion on this troubled world. Feed us with your grace, and grant us the treasure that comes only from you, through Jesus Christ, our Savior and Lord.

Tuesday - Connections with the Liturgy

In the second century, Justin wrote that on Sunday the worshiping community collected money and goods for the needy, and each Sunday worshiping assemblies respond to the call in 1 Timothy to be generous and ready to share with others. See the offering (Evangelical Lutheran Worship, p. 106). Those churches that institute contributions by direct bank withdrawal do well to continue at each Sunday liturgy a symbolic weekly generosity to the poor.

Wednesday - Especially for Children

It is probably not a good idea to urge small children to attend to the homeless persons whom they see on the sidewalks, and many children do not have much discretionary money in order for them to consider use of wealth. Yet they, just like Christian adults, can be nurtured into a life of generosity. The second reading offers also the imagery of "the good fight of faith," which may be interesting to children who are accustomed in our society to the glorification of violence. It is faith in the embrace of God that equips us for the battles of life.

Thursday - Connections with Creation

Amos depicts those who luxuriate in resources—ivory, lambs, calves, wine, finest oils—and use these to feel "at ease" and "secure" (6:1). Those selfish habits, which are condemned by the prophet, are not only matters of human injustice (like the rich man's deprivation of Lazarus), but also create injustice within God's broader ecosystem. God's justice in Psalm 146—caring for the hungry, the captives, the blind, the stranger, and widows and orphans—aligns with the one "who made heaven and earth, the seas, and all that is in them" (v. 6). The abuse of natural resources for selfish ease not only robs other humans in need but undermines the will of God, who created us and all things to live in caring community.

Friday - Reflection on the Gospel Reading

Christians are called to have mercy on all who are in need. That this parable has been so literalized in Christian imagination indicates the power of a well-crafted narrative and people's perpetual fascination with the afterlife. Care must be taken to avoid any such literal interpretation, which would suggest that those who are embraced by God would not care about the suffering of others. Luke's position that "Moses and the prophets" point the world to Christ is a foundational principle of the ecumenical lectionary.

Saturday - Hymn of the Day

Fred Pratt Green, born into a British Anglican family, became a Methodist minister and in his retirement wrote many hymns on topics that were not sufficiently addressed in current collections. "The church of Christ, in every age" (ELW 729) exemplifies his talent. The second stanza sounds like a description of poor Lazarus, and, heeding I Timothy, we join together to "share our bread." May we, as the body of Christ, "keep on rising from the dead."
