READING(S)

First Reading: Genesis 32:22-31

The same night [Jacob] got up and took his two wives, his two maids, and his eleven children and crossed the ford of the Jabbok. He took them and sent them across the stream, and likewise everything that he had. Jacob was left alone, and a man wrestled with him until daybreak. When the man saw that he did not prevail against Jacob, he struck him on the hip socket, and Jacob's hip was put out of joint as he wrestled with him. Then he said, "Let me go, for the day is breaking." But Jacob said, "I will not let you go, unless you bless me." So he said to him, "What is your name?" And he said, "Jacob." Then the man said, "You shall no longer be called Jacob, but Israel, for you have striven with God and with humans and have prevailed." Then Jacob asked him, "Please tell me your name." But he said, "Why is it that you ask my name?" And there he blessed him. So Jacob called the place Peniel, saying, "For I have seen God face to face, yet my life is preserved." The sun rose upon him as he passed Penuel, limping because of his hip.

Gospel Reading: Luke 18:1-8

The Holy Gospel according to Luke, the 18th Chapter. **Glory to you, O Lord!**

Then Jesus told them a parable about their need to pray always and not to lose heart. He said, "In a certain city there was a judge who neither feared God nor had respect for people. In that city there was a widow who kept coming to him and saying, 'Grant me justice against my accuser.' For a while he refused, but later he said to himself, 'Though I have no fear of God and no respect for anyone, yet because this widow keeps bothering me, I will grant her justice, so that she may not wear me out by continually coming.' " And the Lord said, "Listen to what the unjust judge says. And will not God grant justice to his chosen ones who cry to him day and night? Will he delay long in helping them? I tell you, he will quickly grant justice to them. And yet, when the Son of Man comes, will he find faith on earth?"

WEEKLY DEVOTIONS

Monday - Prayer of the Day

O Lord God, tireless guardian of your people, you are always ready to hear our cries. Teach us to rely day and night on your care. Inspire us to seek your enduring justice for all this suffering world, through Jesus Christ, our Savior and Lord.

Tuesday - Connections with the Liturgy

Each Sunday, when perhaps at worship we have wrestled with God, we are sent away with God's blessing. Each Sunday we are instructed in the inspired Scripture, and we receive the proclaimed message. Each Sunday we join with the widow to plead for justice in the world. It is as if the weekly assembly is enacting this Sunday's readings.

Wednesday - Especially for Children

Also children can be encouraged to pray each day, like the widow pestering God with petitions. Help the children in your life think about something to pray for each day this coming week. Lead them to move from self-focused concerns to issues of wider justice of which they are aware.

Thursday - Life on the Earth

Not until the late twentieth century did many Christians think about justice for the earth itself, for the waters and the forests, for the animals. Evangelical Lutheran Worship asks us each week to join the widow in bothering God with petitions for the well-being of also creation itself.

Friday - Reflection on the Gospel Reading

Believers are called to keep faith in God's justice. Come, Lord Jesus, the church prays! By contrast with the unjust judge of the parable, the Son of Man will judge us all at the end. Luke's focus on the needy widow is held next to the depiction of Christ as the judge.

Saturday - Hymn of the Day

One hymn appropriate for the day is "Day by day" (ELW 790). This text was written in the late nineteenth century by Carolina Sandell Berg to accompany a story she wrote, in which the pendulum of a clock quits swinging back and forth in frustration at the thought of how many million times it would have to swing over many future years. Berg wrote that we are given life one day at a time and that God's mercy attends us each single day. Like the widow, we struggle day by day. Like Jacob, we seek God's blessings and will in the end see God's face.
