

READING

Reading: *Luke 23:32-43*

Two others also, who were criminals, were led away to be put to death with him. When they came to the place that is called The Skull, they crucified Jesus there with the criminals, one on his right and one on his left. Then Jesus said, "Father, forgive them; for they do not know what they are doing." And they cast lots to divide his clothing. And the people stood by, watching; but the leaders scoffed at him, saying, "He saved others; let him save himself if he is the Messiah of God, his chosen one!" The soldiers also mocked him, coming up and offering him sour wine, and saying, "If you are the King of the Jews, save yourself!" There was also an inscription over him, "This is the King of the Jews." One of the criminals who were hanged there kept deriding him and saying, "Are you not the Messiah? Save yourself and us!" But the other rebuked him, saying, "Do you not fear God, since you are under the same sentence of condemnation? And we indeed have been condemned justly, for we are getting what we deserve for our deeds, but this man has done nothing wrong." Then he said, "Jesus, remember me when you come into your kingdom." He replied, "Truly I tell you, today you will be with me in Paradise."

BRINGING IT HOME

This section provides guidance on how to discuss a passage from the Revised Common Lectionary for the week as a family! The devotions for this week are for Colossians 2: 6-19

Reflection Questions

- This Season after Pentecost helps us grow in God's love. In our story, Paul tells the Colossians to stay strong, or "rooted," in their faith. What other kind and helpful words did Paul share?
- Some people believe we must follow certain rules to be close to God. Paul says that's not what matters most. What rules or messages might make someone feel left out?
- When have you felt loved, safe, or close to God? What helped you feel that way?
- What are some rules or traditions that help people feel close to God? What rules make people feel confused or left out? How can we tell which ones help and which ones don't?


• Sometimes people say we're not good enough. Paul reminds us we belong to Jesus. How does remembering help us when we don't feel good enough or like

we don't belong?

public spaces to remind
others they are loved.



Activity

Create a tree trunk and roots using brown paper on a wall or large surface. Make sure the roots are large and easily visible. Then, cut out a large number of green paper leaves, and set them aside.

Begin by reminding the kids in your life that when we are rooted in God's love, that love helps us grow strong and kind. Our roots remind us who we are and how much we are loved. Ask, "What helps you remember God loves you?" Share your own example first. Then, invite responses. Write each response on a paper root, or invite the children to write it themselves.

Once the roots are filled, turn attention to the top of the empty tree. Trees with strong roots produce healthy leaves. When we remember we are loved by God, we grow, too. Ask, "What grows in us when we are rooted in God's love?" Use the root words to help guide responses. Write each response on a leaf, and tape it to the tree's branches. Offer quiet reflection time for the children to write their own leaves, which they can then place on the tree.

Together, look at the tree to show how being rooted in God's love helps us grow. It reminds us that we belong to God—not because of rules, but because of truth and love. When we are rooted in God's love, it shapes the way we treat others and ourselves, how we trust God, and how we live every day.

Leave the tree up as a visual reminder. Let it continue to grow each week as a symbol of belonging, love, and faith.

Prayer

Loving God, you made us for community, knowing life is much more vibrant together than apart. When we feel lonely, bring us together. When we get distracted, remind us who we are. Together, may we stay rooted in your love. Amen.
